#### Levi loves his new wheelchair!

Dear Shriners.

Our family would like to offer our deepest gratitude for your funding of our son's (Levi Konrad's) first manual wheelchair. As we anticipated, Levi was more than ready to move himself around and he has been learning to navigate his various environments with enthusiasm. It brings our family so much joy to see Levi's pride in his newfound independence- he is using his little wheelchair in his classroom as well as at home on the weekends.

Occasionally, I bring him to his father's workplace - Home Hardware, where he practices navigating his chair through the aisles. Levi also has weekly occupational therapy sessions where he practices maneuvering with precision and he has begun to show an understanding of turning the chair in addition to propelling himself forwards and backwards. He is able to be at the level of his peers at school as well as direct himself to preferred activities and objects. This has given us insight into Levi's interests (as he is non-verbal) and has provided new ground towards expressive communication. We are all ecstatic.


#### **Shriners Family Day**
